KPTEP was developed as part of the Asia-Pacific Teacher Exchange for Global Education in order to support the enhancement of the quality of education in the Philippines through the capacity-building of its key educators, particularly in view of innovative educational practices, global competence, and intercultural literacy required for the 21st-century learner's and educator's competence.

Asia-Pacific Teacher Exchange for Global Education (APTE) is a bilateral teacher exchange program between the Republic of Korea and six partner countries in Asia to promote mutual understanding and exchange of teaching experiences. Sponsored by the Ministry of Education of the Republic of Korea and implemented by APCEIU, in cooperation with the Education Ministries of Indonesia, Malaysia, Mongolia, the Philippines, Thailand, and Vietnam, the program dispatches and invites teachers to and from partner countries and provides participating teachers with opportunities to teach at host schools of the partner country for 3-4 months.



the enhancement of the quality of education in the Philippines through the capacity – building of its key educators and schools, particularly in view of innovative educational practices, global competence and intercultural literacy required for the 21st century learner's and educator's competence.

Recalling the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) Targets 4.7 and 4.c, the role of qualified teachers is critical to respond to such initiatives, and teacher training through international cooperation is considered as an effective way to raise the teachers' global competence. Against this backdrop, the Korean Ministry of Education (MOE Korea) and the Asia-Pacific Centre of Education for International Understanding under the auspices of UNESCO (APCEIU) launched the Teacher Exchange Programme between Korea-Mongolia and Korea-Philippines in 2012 with the aim of implementing Asia-Pacific Teacher Exchange (APTE) Program. Partner countries widened to Indonesia in 2013, Malaysia in 2014, Vietnam in 2015, Thailand in 2016, and Cambodia in 2017.

**Concept Note** 

### Background

The Department of Education with the International Cooperation Office is focusing on Global Citizenship Education (GCED). With globalization, there is a growing need for educational initiatives to capacitate the next generation to be fully functional global citizens. Global Citizenship Education (GCED) is one of the strategic areas of UNESCO's Education Sector program for the period 2014-2021. GCED is guided by the Education 2030 Agenda and Framework for Action, notably Target 4.7 of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDG 4 on Education), which calls on countries to "ensure that all learners are provided with the knowledge and skills to promote sustainable development, including, among others, through education for sustainable development and sustainable lifestyles, human rights, gender equality, promotion of a culture of peace and non-violence, global citizenship and appreciation of cultural diversity and of culture's contribution to sustainable development." Teacher exchange is one way for teachers to gain opportunity for professional development and to broaden their cultural experience to be efficient advocates of GCED. An exemplary model is Asia-Pacific Teacher Exchange for Global Education (APTE), it is a bilateral teacher exchange program between the Republic of Korea and six partner countries in Asia to promote mutual understanding and exchange of teaching experiences. Sponsored by the Ministry of Education of the Republic of Korea and implemented by APCEIU, in cooperation with the Education Ministries of Indonesia, Malaysia, Mongolia, Philippines, Thailand, and Vietnam, the program dispatches and invites teachers to and from partner countries and provides participating teachers with opportunities to teach at host schools of the partner country for 3-4 months. The program is also expected to contribute in enhancing the quality of teachers through international cooperation and to promote GCED as advocated in Education 2030 and Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs)

### Introduction of the Korea-Philippines Teacher Exchange Programme

With globalization, there is a growing need for educational initiatives to inculcate the next generation with capacity as global citizens. As the number of students with diverse cultural backgrounds enrolled in primary and secondary schools in Korea and many other multicultural societies in Asia-Pacific is constantly increasing, measures that could effectively respond to these changes in educational environments are also in urgent need. The Korea-Philippines Teacher Exchange Programme is developed as part of the Asia – Pacific Teacher Exchange for Global Education in order to support
